## COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

### 9:00 a.m. Keynote Address, "BANG FOR THE BUCK: NON-STOP PLANTS FOR YOUR GARDEN"

**Bob Hyland** Color your garden in style this season! Bob will showcase non-stop perennials, shrubs, vines, ornamental grasses and seasonal annuals that yield a high rate of return on your investment. He'll talk about new and underused plants that reward you with vigor, presence, and low maintenance to make your garden a visual treat in all seasons. After 25 years in public garden administration, Bob now co-owns and manages Loomis Creek Nursery, an acclaimed regional retail nursery specializing in garden-worthy plants and pots for Hudson Valley gardens.

### Session 1 (10:10 am – 11:10 am)

**1a. Shade-ology:** Rich Brandes, MG The shady garden is a wonderful refuge where you can take a cooling break from summer's heat and enjoy the serenity of color, texture and unexpected blooms from a wide variety of plants. We'll take a look at unusual and less familiar plants that might make your shade garden your favorite oasis.

**1b. The Weekend Gardener:** Diane Watt, MG Don't let your garden dominate your free time. Diane will show you how you can have a beautiful garden and still enjoy your weekend.

**1c. Building A Sunny Mixed Border:** Victoria Coyne, owner of Victoria Gardens Victoria will discuss building a border from the ground up that will be a feast for your eyes during all the seasons. From berming to mulching and all the fabulous plants between. The mixed border will carry your garden joy into the winter too.

**1d. Design Container Gardens Using Basic Garden Design Principles:** Loretta Campagna, MG Container gardens are all the rage today. If you have hesitated because you're intimidated by the artistic container gardens you see in magazines, or you just don't know how to get started, this class is for you. Learn how to use basic garden design principles to create container gardens that will enhance your landscape & enjoyment through the seasons.

### Session 2 (11:20 am – 12:20 pm)

**2a. Japanese Garden Style – A Place to Ease Your Mind:** Dave Caccamo This talk will include Japanese gardens in Japan and the US as well as in Dave's own garden in New Paltz. Steps in designing & building a Japanese garden, materials, care and sources of materials will be covered. You'll also learn about some of the false myths that surround Japanese gardens.

**2b. The Moonlight Scented Garden:** Diane Watt, MG A moonlight scented garden is a garden planned and planted to visit during the evening or late night hours. Plants that become magically scented when the sun goes down can be enjoyed in a totally different way than daytime blooming flowers. Let Diane take the mystery out of this unique way of gardening.

**2c. The Decorated Garden:** Denise Maurer, Rensselaer Co. MG A beautiful garden, like a gown, is only a beginning. Now it is time to add the extra sparkle and "wow" by selecting accessories that highlight and showcase your little bit of paradise. Using the elements of design you'll be able to create vignettes & focal points that make a walk through your garden truly magical.

**2d. Starting From Scratch:** Barbara Bravo, MG Take this journey with me as an overgrown shrubby thicket is transformed into a beautiful partly shaded garden on the woodland's edge. In the process we'll look at basic design, breaking ground, walls, paths and edging and the final planting of the garden.

### Session 3 (1:25 pm – 2:25 pm)

**3a. Tools – Less Are More: How to determine which tools work best for you and how to get many uses from one tool:** Sally Spillane, professional gardener and host of the Gardening Show on WKZE (98.1 FM) Learn tool organization & care, how to evaluate and shop for tools, get the most out of the tools you already have, and the right tool for the job. Bring your favorite small tool if you like, and of course, all your tool questions.

**3b. The English Cottage Garden:** Denise Dourdeville, MG Thatched roof villages and charming door yards brimming with color and fragrance. This class will trace the origins of this style and identify some of the elements

& plants you can use to bring that feeling home to your cottage in the Hudson Valley.

**3c. A Beautiful, Practical, Ornamental Vegetable Garden – The Potager:** Cecily Frazier, MG A French vegetable garden, the potager, is everything we expect in a good kitchen garden and moreover, it is gorgeous, combining vegetables with herbs and flowers in a classic design that has developed since Roman times. Cecily will teach you the ins and outs of the potager, and give you a whirlwind tour of France and it's beautiful gardens at the same time. Bon appetit!

**3d & 4d. Pruning Trees & Shrubs:** DeVerne Rist PhD, plant pathologist & owner of "Healthy Plants" This 2 session class starts with a classroom discussion of pruning fundamentals for trees and shrubs. Weather permitting, we'll move "to the field" during the 2<sup>nd</sup> session for a live outdoors pruning demonstration.

### Session 4 (2:35 pm – 3:35 pm)

**4a. Make Your Garden Deer Resistant:** Barbara Bravo, MG While there is probably no plant that is "deer proof", there are ways to make your garden deer resistant. Learn to choose plants that deer find less tasty and techniques that will help you to protect your valuable garden plants from foraging deer.

**4b. The Vertical Garden:** Cheryl Alloway, MG Vines & trellises add color and drama to the garden while being economical in their garden footprint. We'll explore climbing plants for all sites as well as the structures best suited to grow them on.

**4c. Birdscaping Your Backyard With the Whole Family in Mind:** Mark DeDea, caretaker of the Forsyth Nature Center Join Mark in a discussion about 2 of his favorite topics. Gardening principles & landscape design coupled with family friendly activities can make birdscaping your backyard a year round endeavor; benefiting your avian guests and teaching family members important practices that benefit your neighborhood environment.
