Cornell Cooperative Extension of Ulster County 4-H Horse Show Seeks Riders

Attention all area equestrians involved in competitive horse showing! The 39th Annual Ulster County Open Horse Show sponsored by the Ulster County 4-H Horse Program Development Committee will be held Sunday, May 15, 2004 beginning at 8:30 a.m., and run throughout the day at the Ulster County Fairgrounds on Libertyville Road in New Paltz, New York. Riders do not need to be enrolled in 4-H to participate. Riders can compete in over forty classes in hunt and stock seat. Grand and reserve championships are presented in junior, senior, short stirrup, children's and walk-trot in both english and western divisions. There is also a lead line class for new riders. A trophy and six ribbons will be awarded in every class as well as several perpetual trophies including high-point horse and rider. Prepaid entries are \$8 per class. Day of show is \$10 per class. All competitors must present a negative Coggins test and a rabies certificate. Riders of all levels are encouraged to enter. The proceeds of the show support the Ulster County 4-H Horse Program and the Marion Hinkleman Scholarship, which is available to a graduating high school student enrolled in the Ulster County 4-H Horse Program.
