FREE Workshops Offer Tips on how to Budget Money & Manage Credit Cards

CCEUC will be offering a FREE two part workshop called Making Ends Meet, on Saturday February 13 and Saturday February 20 at the Ellenville Public Library and Museum located at 40 Center Street in Ellenville from 10:00am to 12:00pm.

Participants will learn how to develop a spending plan, budgeting and saving skills, identify opportunities to reduce expenses, how to manage credit card debt and how to establish and reach their financial goals.
