Stream Stewardship Class: Mapping Invasive Plants

On Sat., July 26, Stream Steward Volunteers will learn to use a Global Positioning Unit to record and map locations of the invasive plant, Japanese Knotweed. Maps will be used to develop a plan for control of the invasive plants in tributaries of Esopus Creek, where the invasive plants have taken hold only in a few locations.
